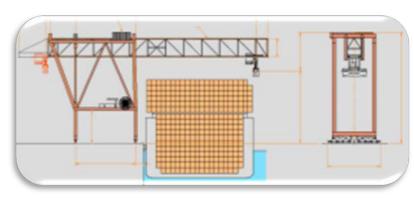

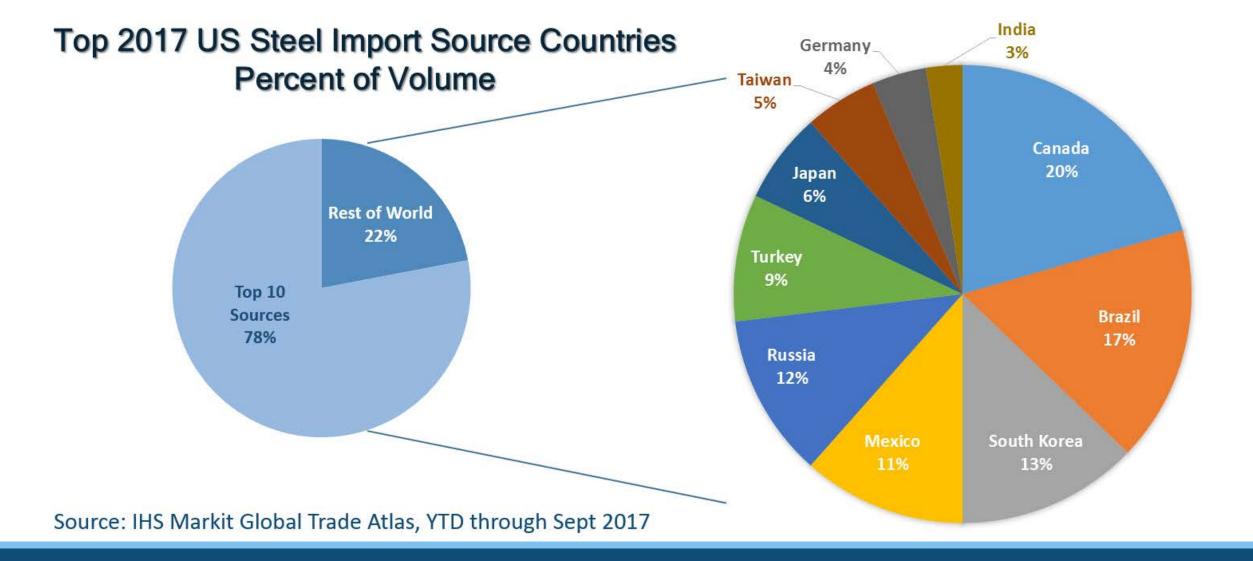

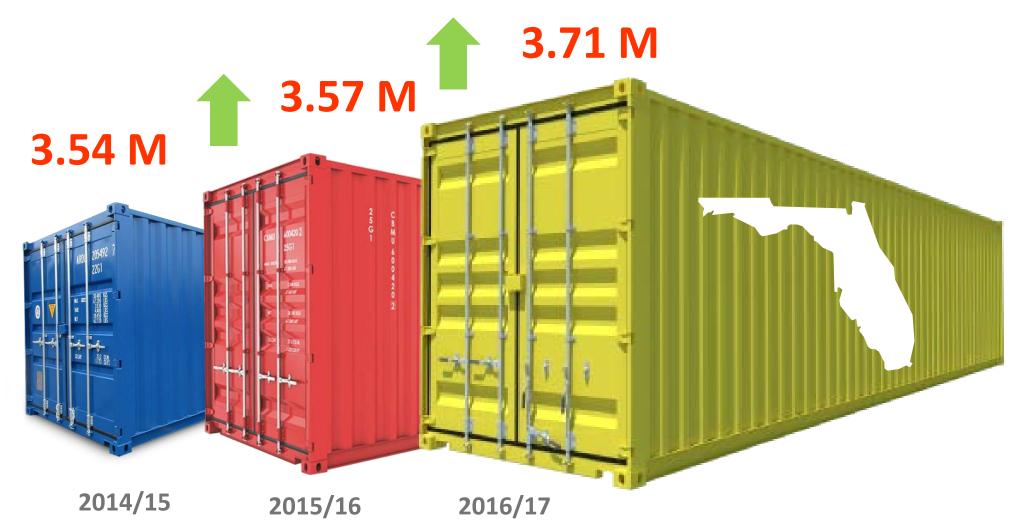

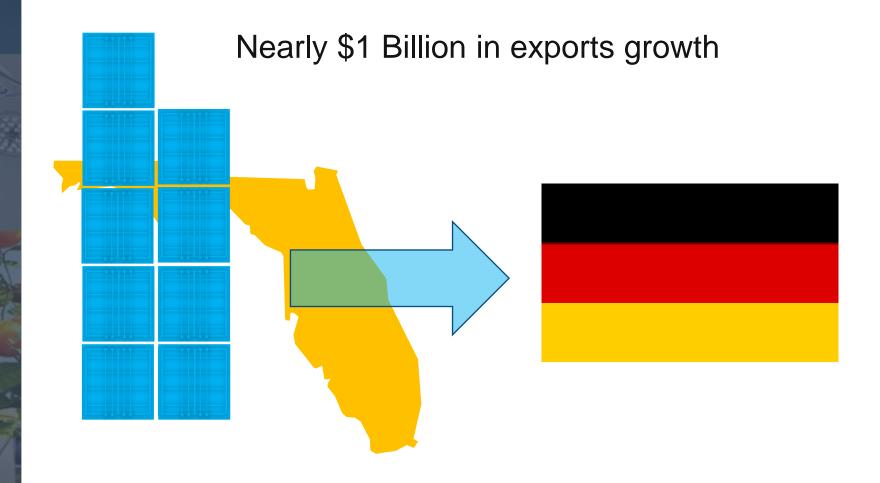

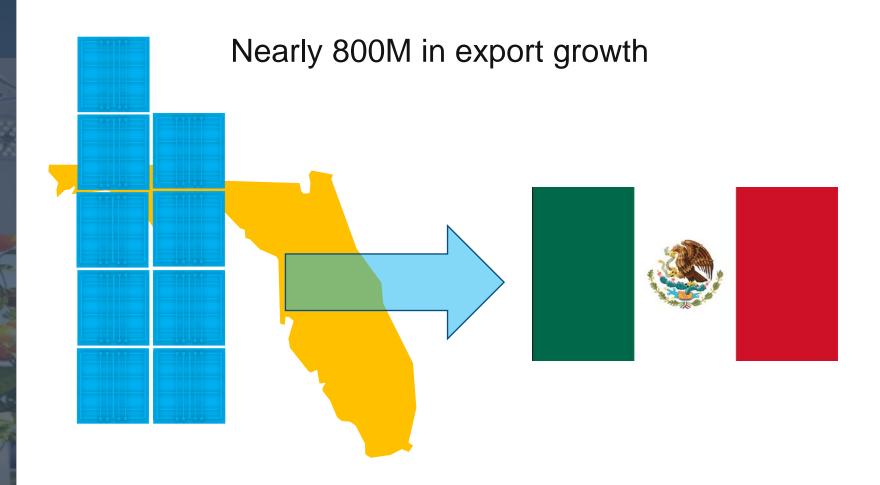

Paraguay: April 22 presidential and legislative elections

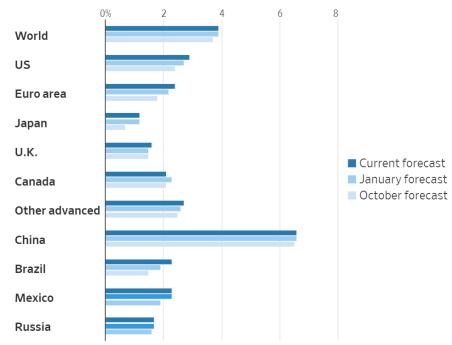

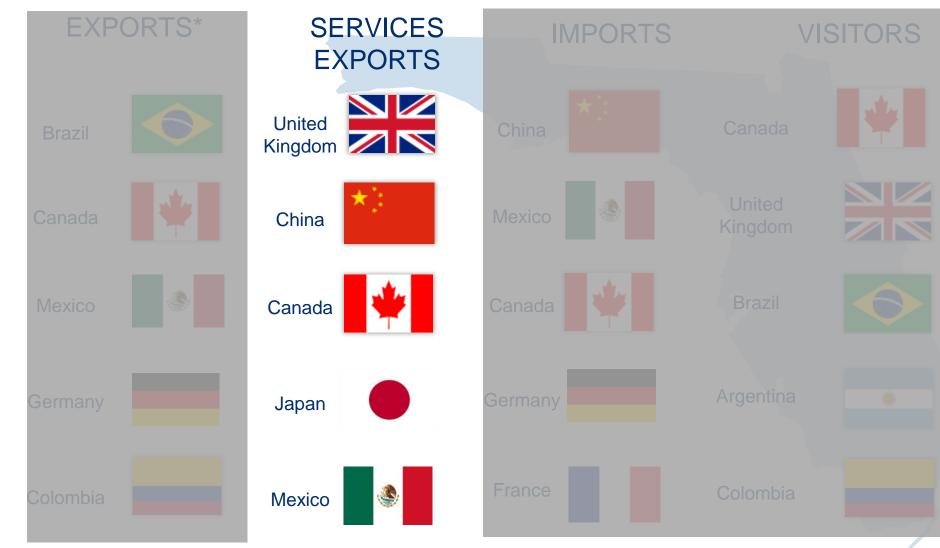

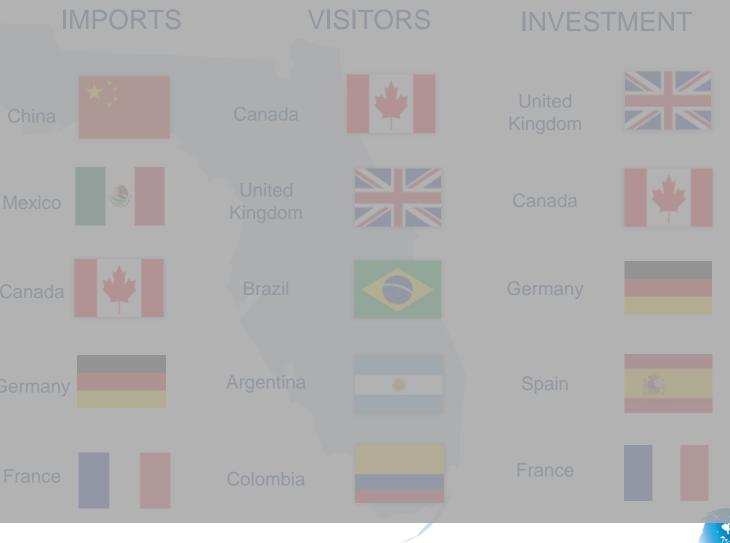

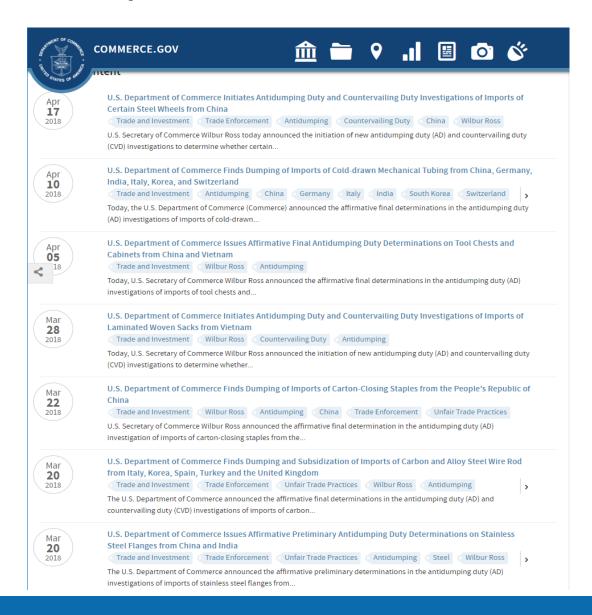

Key Takeaways

- 1. Brazil/LATAM are coming back- but there is completion by other states.
- 2. Florida S a trade and logistics state strong port performance (air and sea), healthy trade partner diversification coupled with significant sector job growth.
- 3. Services matter robust export growth with good prospects for the future. Services support export manufacturing, travel and tourism.
- **4. FDI has room for growth** Florida is punching under its weight. Need to develop a strategy to target existing U.S. FDI sources.
- 5. There are disruptors:
 - Tariffs and U.S. protectionism <u>risk</u>
 - E-commerce opportunity as long as Florida maintains its strategic focus on logistics and infrastructure
 - Political uncertainty <u>risk</u>
