


- Florida's Economy \$1 Trillion GDP (17<sup>th</sup> largest in the world)
- 21 Million Residents (3<sup>rd</sup> / +5M by 2030 / more than 1,000/day)
  - 1.7 million jobs needed
  - Orange County needs 201,217
- 116.5 Million Visitors in 2017
- 3.5% Unemployment Rate
  - 245,300 jobs looking for people
  - 358,000 people looking for jobs
- 57,157 active reemployment assistance claimants




## **Job Creation**


#### August 2017 to September 2018 – 13 Months

- Not using September 2017 because of the effects of Hurricane Irma (showed the temporary loss of 166,900 jobs)
- Florida Job Creation Rate: 2.7% (13 months)
- Top Counties for Jobs: Orange – 38,357 Broward 27,918 Hillsborough 22,784
- 6 Florida Counties Lost Jobs over past 13 months




## Year-over-Year **Population Changes** 2016-2017





## Growth to 2030 by Age Group






## Florida's 2018 3rd Grade **Reading Scores**

Florida Average: 57 % Range: 29 to 78


Statewide: **95,232** 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders not reading at grade level in 2018

**7,511** of Orange County's 3<sup>rd</sup> graders are not reading at grade level








## Households in Leon County Living Below the Poverty Level

- At 9,131 zip code 32304 is top zip code for households in poverty in Florida















#### Governor's Race By County (Gillum 13 – DeSantis 54)






#### The Trump Map By County (Clinton 9 – Trump 58)


