


- Florida's Economy \$1 Trillion GDP (17th largest in the world)
- 21 Million Residents (3rd / +5M by 2030 / more than 1,000/day)
 - 1.7 million jobs needed

- 57,157 active reemployment assistance claimants








Job Creation


August 2017 to September 2018 – 13 Months

- Not using September 2017 because of the effects of Hurricane Irma (showed the temporary loss of 166,900 jobs)
- Florida Job Creation Rate: 2.7% (13 months)
- Top Counties for Jobs: Orange – 38,357 Broward 27,918 Hillsborough 22,784
- 6 Florida Counties Lost Jobs over past 13 months




Year-over-Year **Population Changes** 2016-2017




Age Group

Growth to 2030 by Age Group






Florida's 2018 3rd Grade **Reading Scores**

Florida Average: 57 % Range: 29 to 78


Statewide: **95,232** 3rd Graders not reading at grade level in 2018

7,511 of Orange County's 3rd graders are not reading at grade level








Households in Leon County Living Below the Poverty Level

- At 9,131 zip code 32304 is top zip code for households in poverty in Florida















Governor's Race By County (Gillum 13 – DeSantis 54)






The Trump Map By County (Clinton 9 – Trump 58)


