






Why the Florida Chamber Foundation is Leading the Effort

- (ALICE/United Way).








Florida 2030 Blueprint Goal

Less than 10% of Florida children will live in poverty, and 100% will have a pathway out.

















Florida's 2018 3rd Grade Reading Scores


