







2020 Proposed Constitutional Amendments

An initiative petition to add an amendment to Florida Constitution must collect and submit 766,200 signatures to Supervisor of Elections' offices. These amendments must also be ruled compliant with current Florida Statutes on amendment language and summaries by the Florida Supreme Court

Currently....

- 24 Active Proposed Amendments Have Been Approved to Collect Signatures to be on the 2020 ballot by the Division of Elections
- 9 Proposed Amendments Have Already Made Review for Consideration by the Attorney General & FL Supreme Court (Collecting and Submitting More Than 76,632 Valid Signatures)
- 1 Amendment ("Citizenship Requirement to Vote in Florida Elections") Has Already Been Certified to be on the 2020 General Election Ballot



March 17, 2020:

Presidential Preference Primary (February 18, 2020 deadline to update party registration to be eligible to vote)

Noon April 27, 2020 – Noon, May 1, 2020: Qualifying for Congress, State Attorney, Public Defender & Judges

Noon, June 15, 2020 – Noon, June 19, 2020: Qualifying for State Senator, State Representative

Tuesday, August 18, 2020: Primary Election

Tuesday, November 3, 2020: General Election





VOTER REGISTRATION By Party









WHITE MALE REP & NPA/OTH VOTERS OVER 30 WHO REGISTERED BUT DID NOT VOTE IN








BALLOT INITIATIVES PASSED VS BALLOTS MADE By Election Year
