

Florida's Economy At A Glance


- Florida's Economy \$1 Trillion GDP (17th)





Probability of a Florida Recession











Ending Generational Poverty


870,505 kids under-18 living in poverty

Florida 2030 Goal: Less than 10% of Florida children live in poverty and 100% have a pathway out


- Florida has 983 zip codes
- Half of all children in poverty live in just 15% of Florida's zip codes (150)



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

- Entire FL House/about half FL Senate on ballot
 - 7 term-limited Florida Senate members
 - 18 term-limited Florida House members
- All Florida congressional races
- Constitutional Amendments
- >2500 local elections


2020 Legislative Outlook


