Innocent Sellers



SB 896: Sen. Brandes

Improves Florida's bottom-five legal climate by eliminating vicarious liability for product sellers in a product liability action.





Vicarious Liability Reform



SB 1738: Sen. Brandes HB 977: Rep. Rommel

Clarifies that the dangerous instrumentality doctrine, which does not apply to rental vehicles, also does not apply to loaner vehicles when a car is being serviced and certain insurance requirements are met.

Solicitation of Legal Services



SB 1288: Sen. Wright HB 7083: Rep. Leek

Increases health safety by adding certain requirements and disclosures for advertisements that intend to solicit legal services from patients of medical devices and pharmaceuticals.





Florida Commission on Human Relations



SB 726: Sen. Rouson HB 255: Rep. Antone

Clarifies that for discrimination complaints before the Florida Commission on Human Relations, the statute of limitations is one year for an aggrieved party regardless of whether the Commission made a reasonable cause determination within 180 days. This fixes a 2000 Florida Supreme Court decision, Joshua v. City of Gainesville.

Minimum Wage



SB 456: Sen. Rodriguez HB 691: Rep. Jacquet

Incrementally increases the state minimum wage to over \$15 an hour to the detriment of small businesses and certain employees.





Discrimination in Labor and Employment



SB 90: Sen. Stewart HB 739: Rep. Thompson

Interferes in employment practices by prohibiting a job creator from requesting or relying on previous wage or salary information to interview, hire, promote or employ an employee.

SB 566: Sen. Bracy HB 761: Rep. Brown

Creates a new cause of action by adding hairstyle to the list of protected classes, such as gender, race or creed, under which it's unlawful to discriminate for housing or employment opportunities.





Unlawful Discrimination – Height/Weight



SB 644: Sen. Braynon HB 635: Rep. B. Watson

Creates a new cause of action by adding height and weight to the list of protected classes, such as gender, race or creed, under which it's unlawful to discriminate for housing or employment opportunities.





Pregnant Employees



HB 795: Rep. Joseph

Interferes in the employer-employee relationship by creating new mandates for employers of pregnant employees.





Employment Practices



SB 1194: Sen. Cruz HB 889: Rep. Davis

Creates a new cause of action and interferes with the employeremployee relationship by mandating job creators provide up to three months of paid family leave for the birth, adoption or foster care placement of a new child.





Heat Related Illness



SB 882: Sen. Torres, Jr. HB 513: Rep. C. Smith

Adds redundant mandates for job creators with employees that regularly perform work outside.





Background Screening (Ban the Box)



SB 616: Sen. Powell HB 473: Rep. Omphroy

Prohibits job creators from requesting information about an applicant's criminal history prior to an initial job interview, regardless of the nature of employment.

Medical Marijuana Employee Protection



SB 962: Sen. Berman HB 595: Rep. Polsky

Eliminates the ability of job creators to maintain a Drug-Free Workplace by creating a new cause of action against employers that take an adverse action against a person who tests positive for medical marijuana while on the job.





Overtime Pay



SB 1436: Sen. Torres, Jr.

Interferes in the employer-employee relationship by mandating overtime pay for all salaried employees earning less than \$51,064 a year, regardless of employee class or existing benefit and wage structure.





Wage and Employment Benefits Requirements



SB 1520: Sen. Rodriguez HB 6065: Rep. C. Smith

Encourages a patchwork of burdensome regulations by allowing local governments to set minimum wage requirements and mandated benefit requirements.





Preemption of Conditions of Employment



SB 1126: Sen. Gruters HB 305: Rep. Rommel

Prohibits local governments from passing regulations on businesses that interfere with conditions of employment, including wages, scheduling, benefits and background screening.





Home Delivery Services



SB 1796: Sen. Perry HB 1129: Rep. Caruso

Creates a new cause of action and mandates level II background screenings for the delivery of household goods.

Sales Tax Modernization



SB 126: Sen. Gruters HB 159: Rep. Clemons

Modernizes Florida's tax code and levels the playing field for main street businesses by allowing for the collection of sales tax already due from internet retailers.





Corporate Income Tax



SB 1576: Sen. Rodriguez HB 6021: Rep. Eskamani

Increases the corporate income tax burden on Florida businesses by eliminating the rate reduction that was provided by the legislature in response to the increased tax base as a result of the federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act.





Communications
Services Tax



SB 1174: Sen. Hutson HB 701: Rep. Fischer

Streamlines and reduces the local communications services tax, reducing the tax burden for Florida families and job creators.





Small Business Exemption – Business Rent Tax



SB 1778: Sen. Gruters HB 1141: Rep. Caruso

Exempts small businesses under a certain number of employees from the business rent tax, the Florida-only sales tax charged on commercial leases.





Corporate Income Tax Combined Reporting



SB 1596: Sen. Rodriguez

Mandates an affiliated group of corporations with common ownership file a combined water's edge corporate income tax return, which may include income that may not be attributable to Florida.

Small Business Saturday



SB 1052: Sen. Taddeo

Supports shopping at local small businesses by eliminating the sales tax on purchases on the Saturday after Thanksgiving.





Property Tax Exemptions Used by Hospitals



HB 919: Rep. Caruso

Treats non-profit hospitals differently for property tax purposes than other non-profits.

Mitigated Language Included in HB 7097



Litigation Financing Consumer Protection



SB 1828: Sen. Broxson HB 7041: Rep. Leek

Protects injured parties from unscrupulous lenders offering high interest rates that hope to take advantage of the lawsuit and draw out litigation in favor of a greater reward that doesn't always make the injured party whole.





Municipal Litigation



SB 1574: Sen. Baxley HB 7043: Rep. Gregory

Extends similar attorney fee caps in state litigation to municipal litigation with contingency fee arrangements.





Taxation



HB 7097: Rep. Avila

Provides for sales tax holidays and changes how the property tax exemption for nonprofit hospitals is calculated on a statewide basis.
