

AdventHealth hospitals in the West Florida Division will provide rapid testing for coronavirus, the health care system announced Tuesday. AdventHealth will use the Cepheid Xpert Xpress SARS-CoV-2 device for patients who are in the system's care and meet the evaluation criteria for COVID-19 testing. The federal government granted emergency authorization for the device and its specialized cartridges to be used for rapid laboratory testing as the pandemic has worsened,


Wells Fargo

Wells Fargo announced a number of measures related to COVID-19 relief. Anyone can cash their CARES Act relief checks at a Wells Fargo branch with no fees and, for 30 days, Wells Fargo will pause the collection of negative balances existing at a time when relief checks are deposited, allowing account holders full access to their payments. Additionally, Wells Fargo is suspending residential property foreclosure sales, evictions, and involuntary automobile repossessions. They are also offering on a case-by-case basis fee waivers, payment deferrals, and other assistance for credit card, auto, mortgage, small business, and personal lending.

- 675,000 childcare businesses, mostly small businesses, employing 1.5 million workers
- Children under 5 in regular childcare:
 - 47.4% of all infants (birth to one year) are in childcare;
 - 54% of 1 and 2 year-old children are in childcare; and
 - 73% of 3-and 4-year old children are in childcare.
- Two-thirds of American families with children under the age of six are dependent on childcare







"It's not a coincidence that Florida schools climbed to new heights at the same time more parents were given more choice. We now have 300,000 students attending charter schools, 150,000 attending private pre-schools (VPK) using state funding, 140,000 attending K-12 private schools with vouchers or tax credit scholarships. We also have more than 700,000 using district choice, be it dual enrollment, International Baccalaureate programs, career academies, etc. Altogether, 47 percent of Florida students now attend something other than their zoned schools, up from 10 percent a generation ago."


