We believe no child should wonder where their next meal will come from. We believe that no child should wonder where they will sleep at night. We believe that no child should worry about who will protect them.

Florida's childhood poverty rate to less than 10% and create a
pathway to prosperity for everyone who wants to achieve it.

The 10 Root Causes of Generational Poverty

Our research into childhood poverty identified ten root causes that create the cycle of generational poverty;

- Lack of employment opportunities
- Lack of education & workforce development
- Unaffordable and unattainable housing
- Poor transportation options
- Disproportionate adverse health outcomes
- Food insecurity
- Unaffordable & unattainable child care and family care
- Unsafe environments,
- Imbalance of outcomes in the criminal justice system,
- Lack of community voice and self-agency

Our passion to ensure every person has the opportunity to reach their fullest potential is why, six years ago, we created the Florida Chamber's Prosperity Initiative.
