






What is your opinion on Florida's Economy for 2021?






When vaccines are available to the general public, regarding your employees, will you:






In thinking about COVID lawsuits against responsible employers, how important is it for the legislature to enact COVID-19 liability protections for Florida businesses?






In late December, Florida businesses received their state Reemployment Tax Rate Notice for wages paid on or after January 1, 2021. Which of the following best describes your tax notice?












The Third Grade Reading Score
