



 New U.S. Jobs since 2015





















Labor Force Changes: December 2019 to December 2020












Palm Beach County Under-18 Poverty





2019 Kids in Poverty





Boca Raton and Surrounding Area Under-18 Poverty











Palm Beach County Registered Voters – as of January 25th, 2021







Commerce & Tourism
Rules

HB 7 and SB 72 (Identical)

What the Bill Does:

- Protect business entities, educational institutions, governmental entities, and religious institutions and its persons
- · Heighten the standard
- Support a good faith effort
- Apply retroactively
- Implement a 1 year statue of limitations

What the Bill Does Not:

- Include health care providers or facilities
- · Offer blanket immunity to bad actors
- Provide protections past the conclusion of the pandemic
- Deny injured parties the ability to have their day in court
