







 - 160 Legislators
 - House- R: 78 (+5), D: 42 (-5)
 - Senate- R: 24 (+1), D: 16 (-1)
- \$96.6B State Budget (\$2.74B COVID Gap)
- Bills Filed: 2,990 (So Far)
 - 1,973 House / 1,017 Senate
 - **103** Florida Chamber Scored Bills
- Florida Chamber has testified 68 times
- Sent 77 Your Vote Matters Letters (So Far)
- 1180 Votes Scored (So Far)
- Bills Passed : 7 House / 20 Senate
- **192** Florida Chamber meetings with legislators




