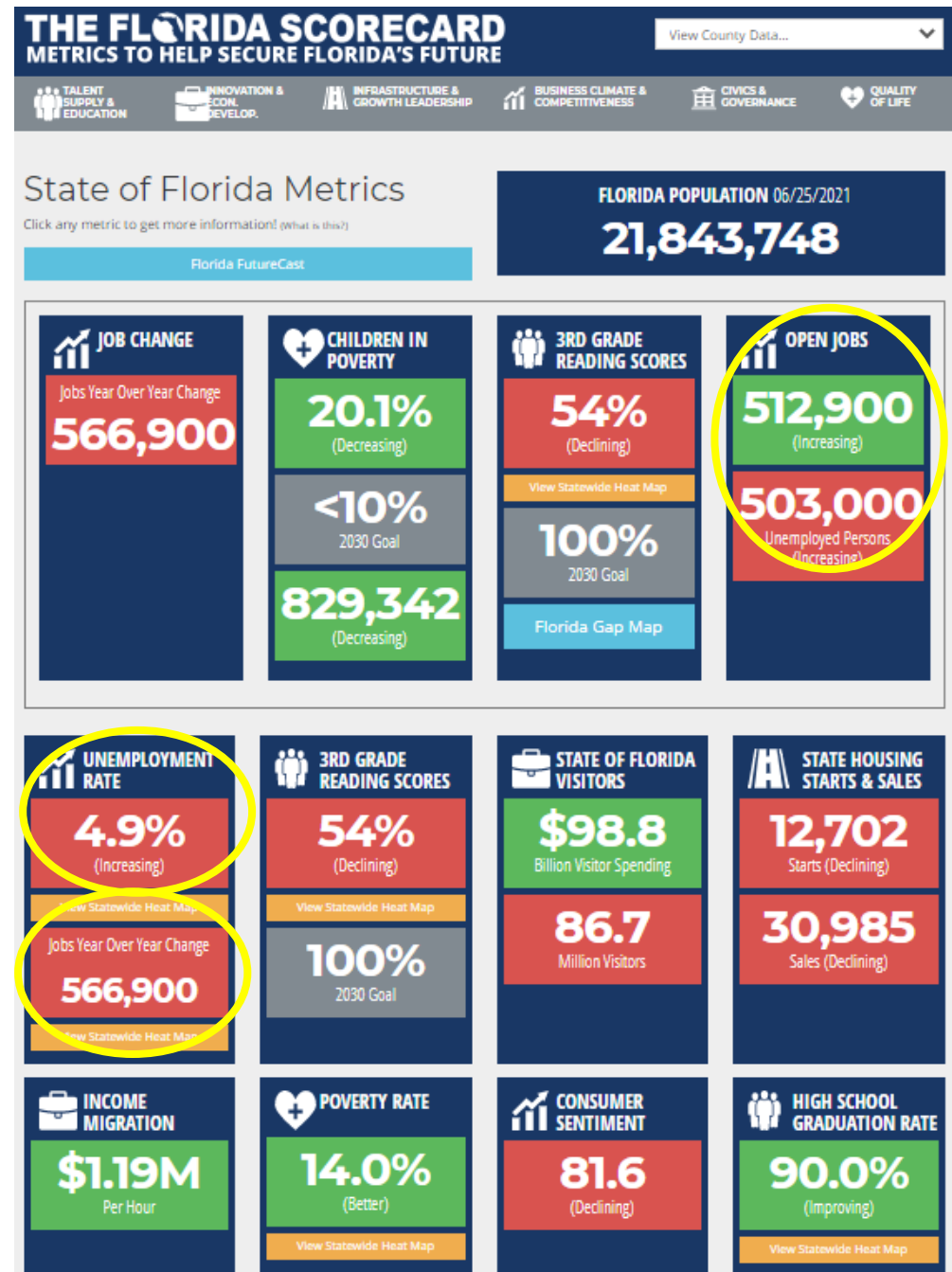

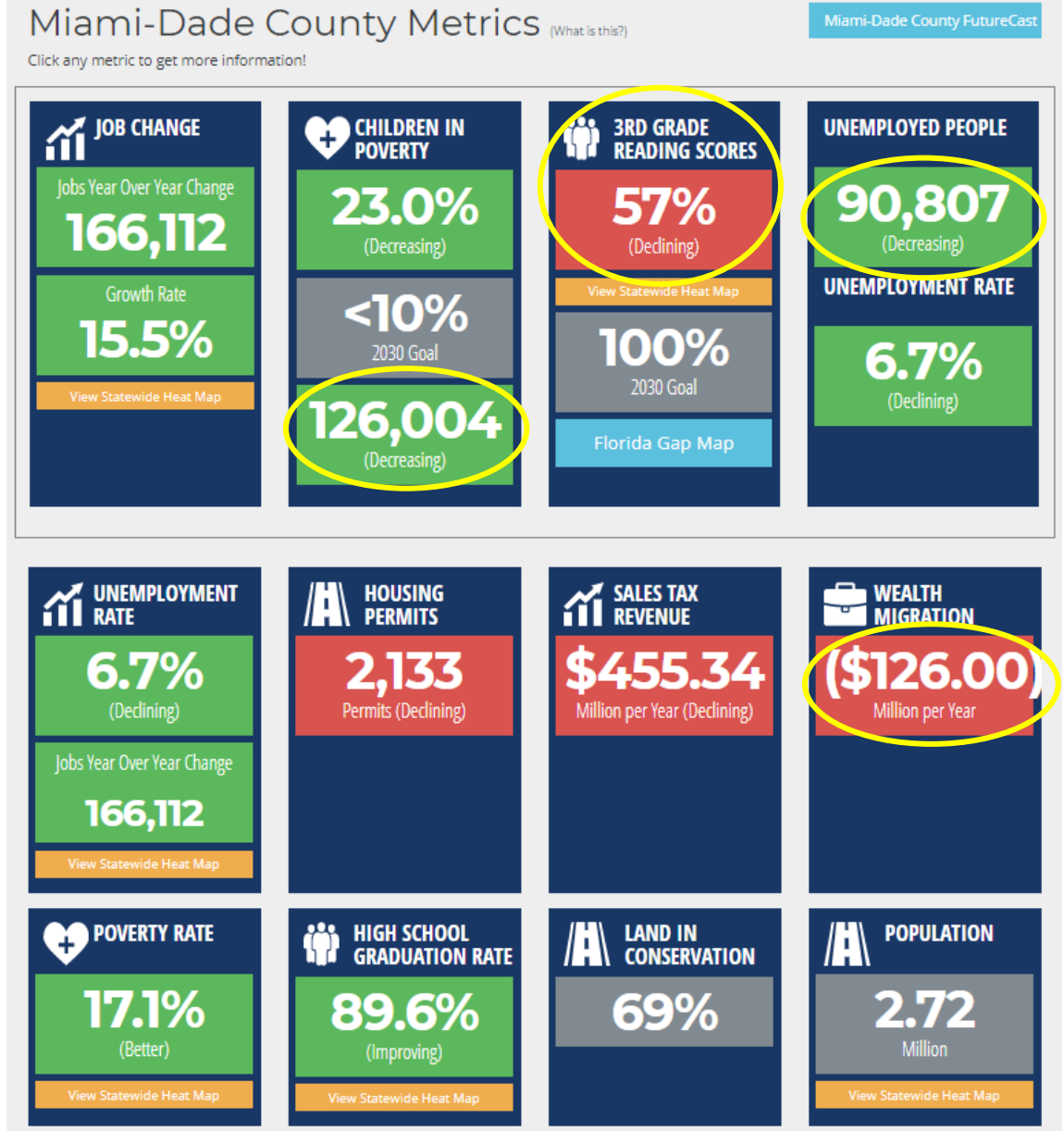

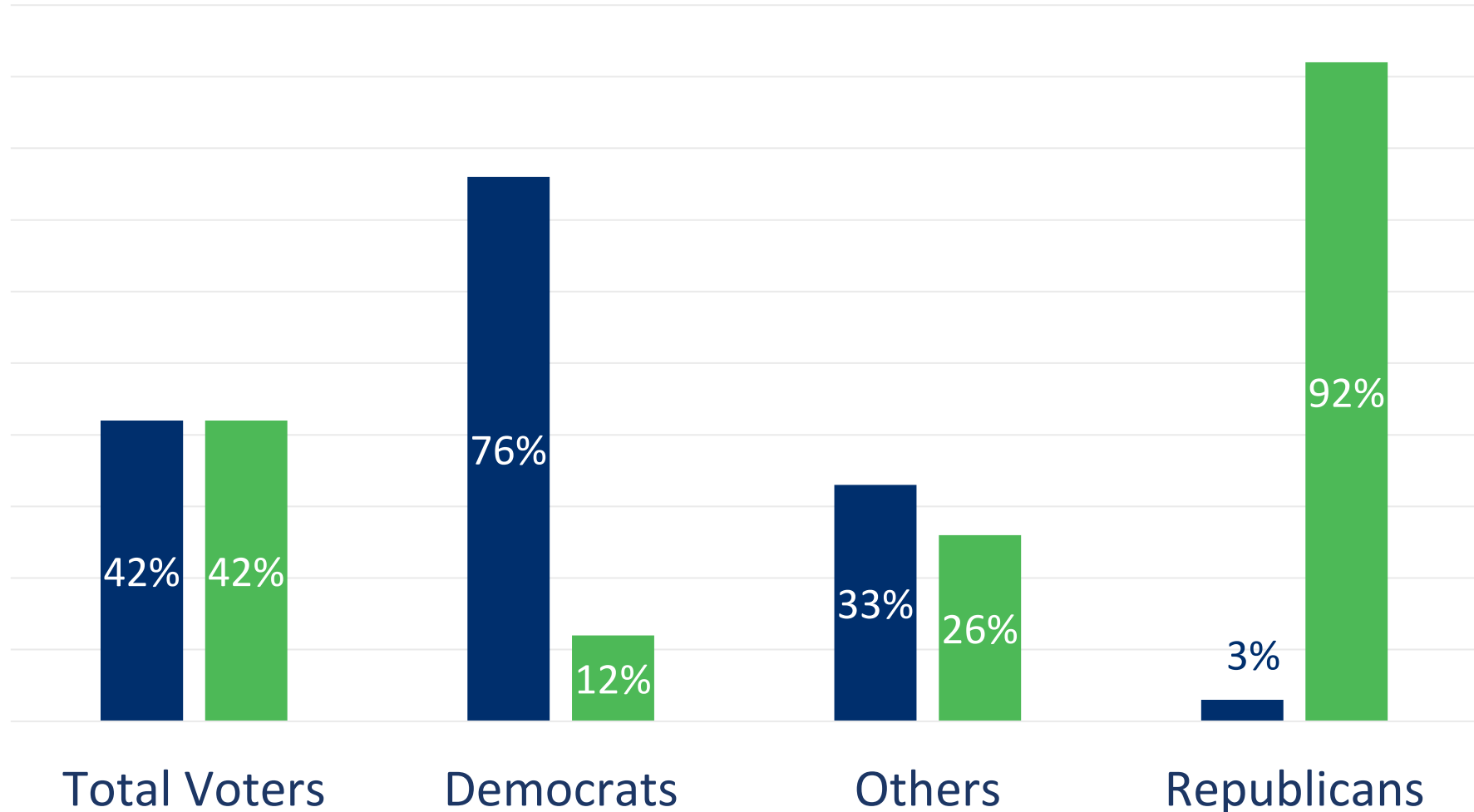

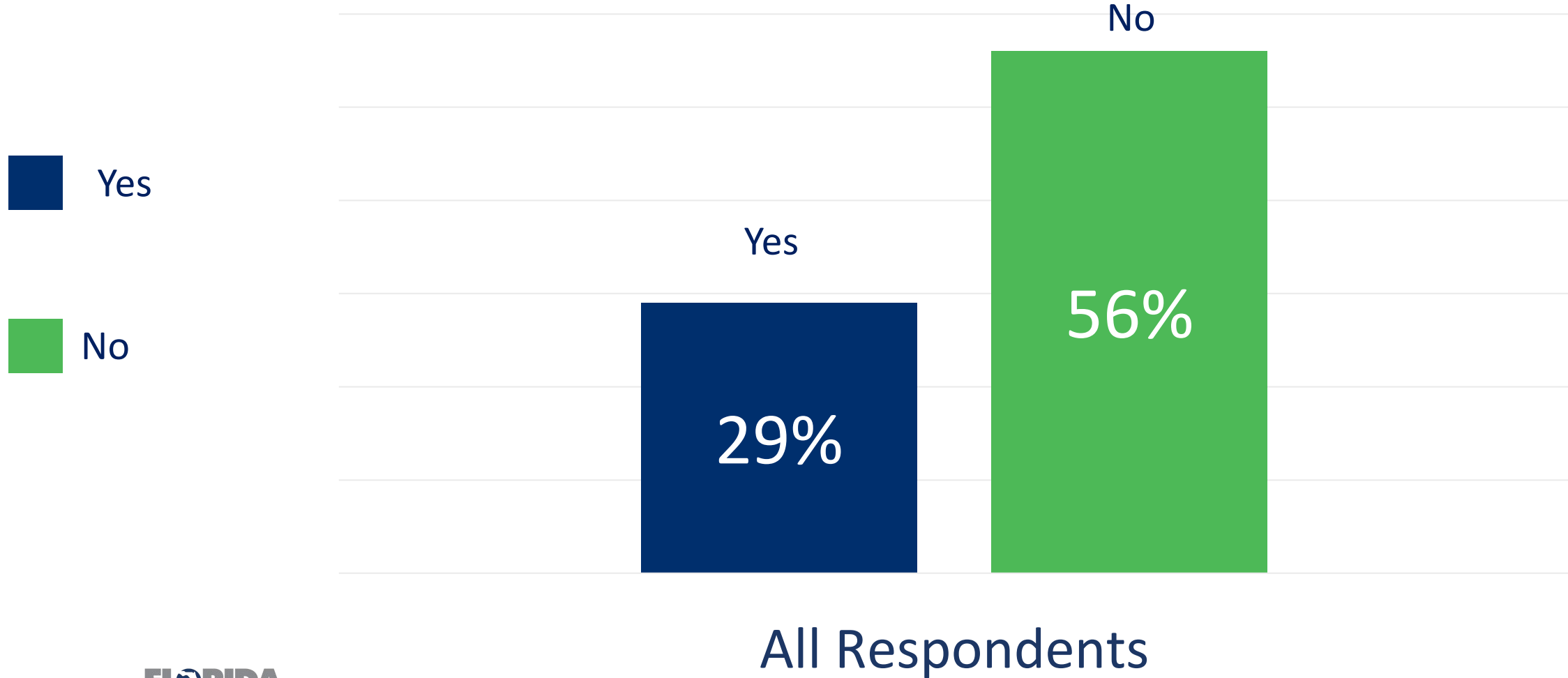

There are 32 proposed Amendments for the 2022 Ballot.

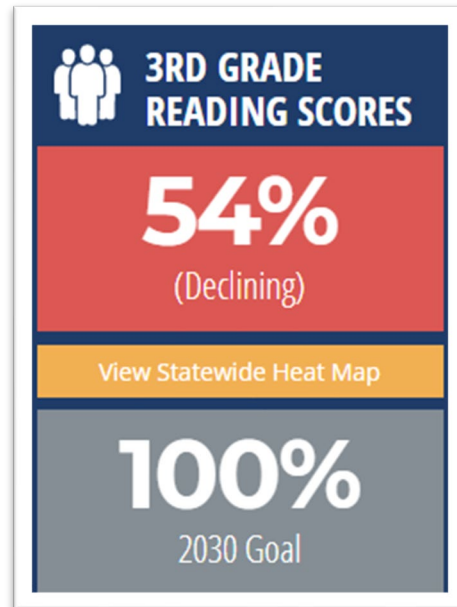

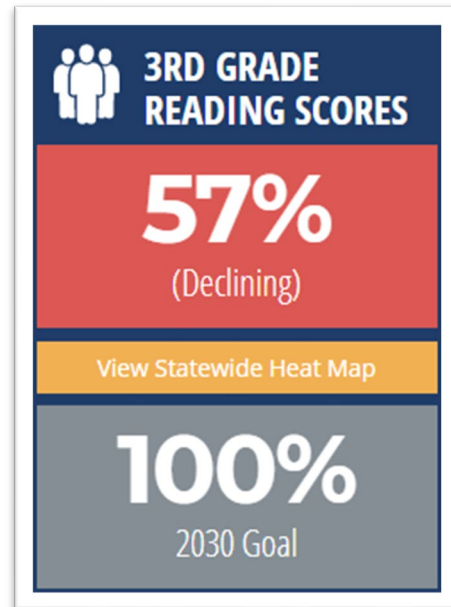

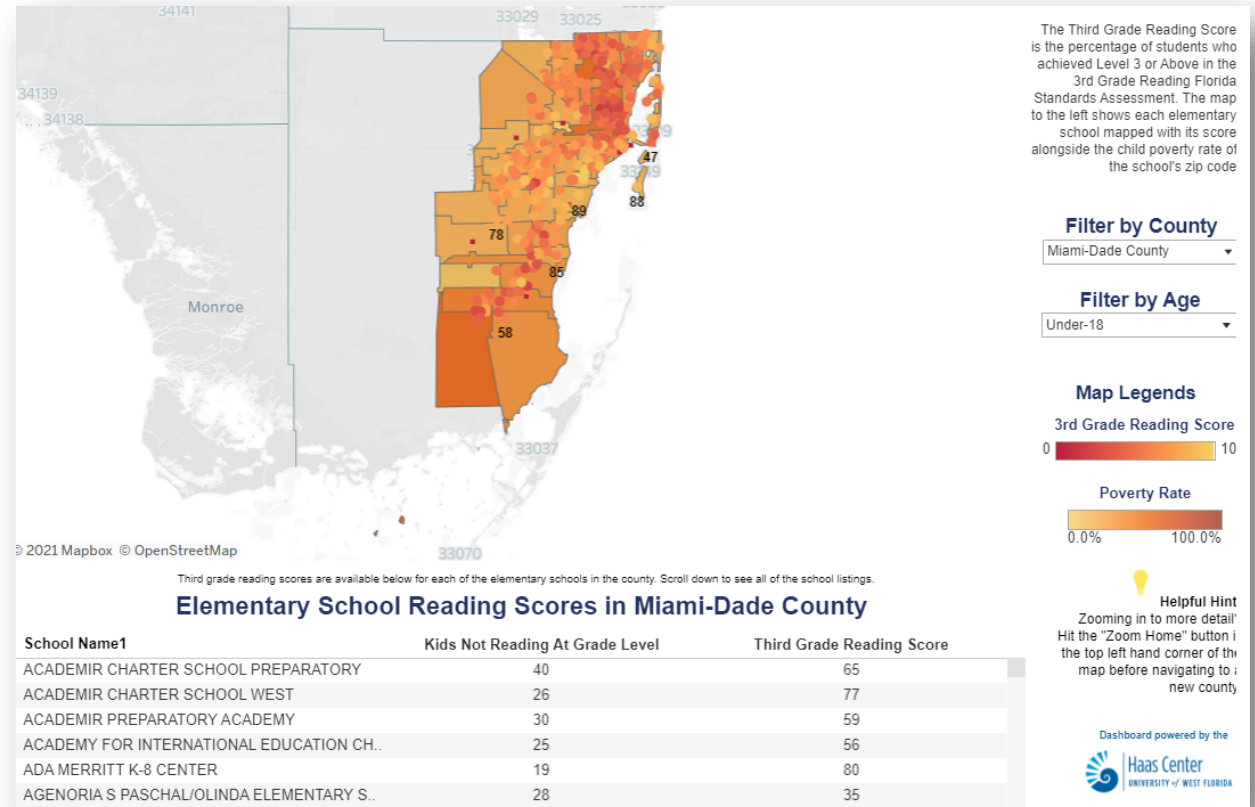

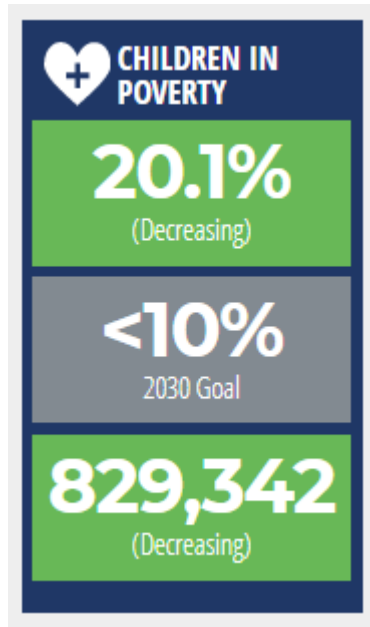

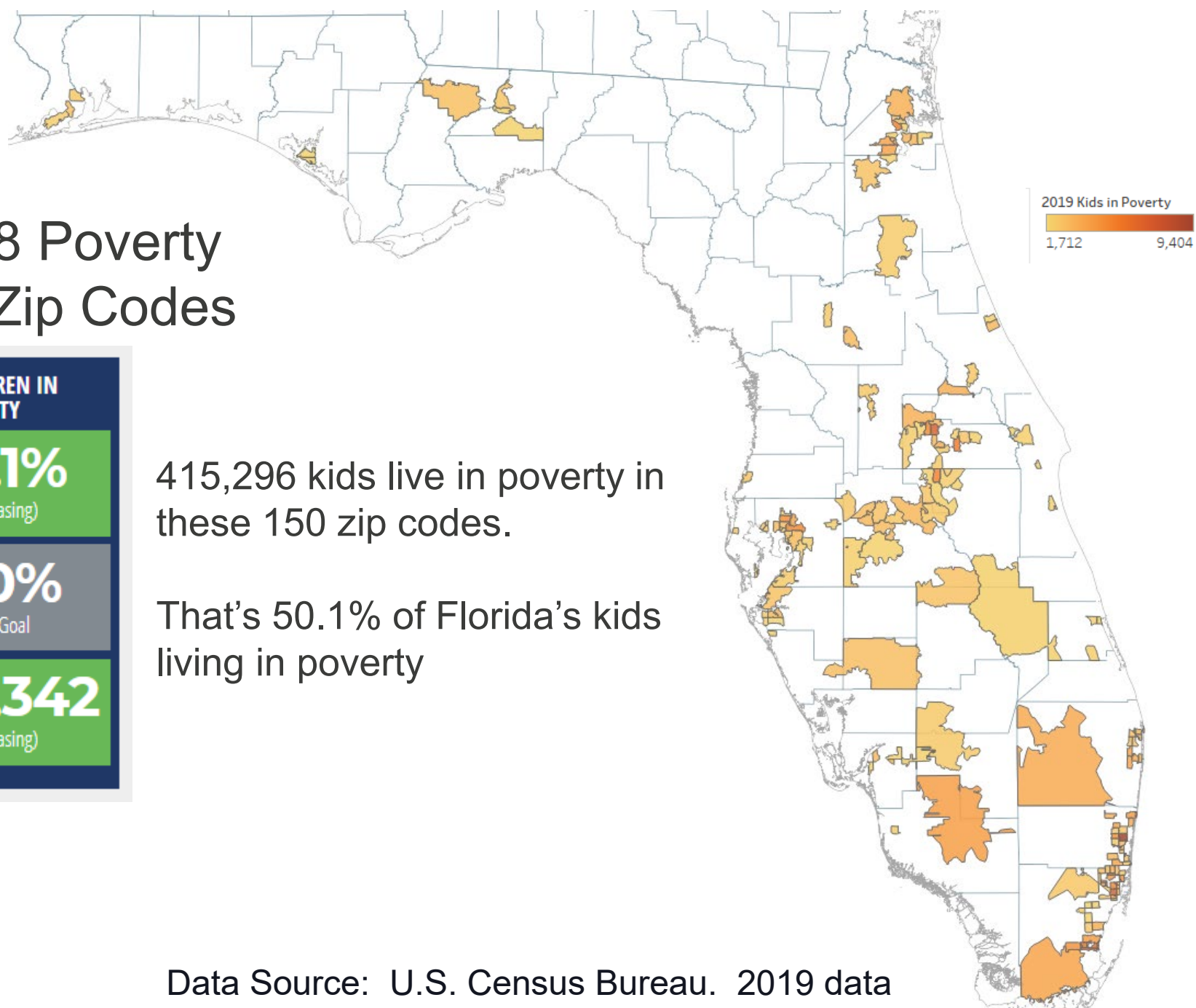


Under-18 Poverty Top 150 Zip Codes



415,296 kids live in poverty in these 150 zip codes.

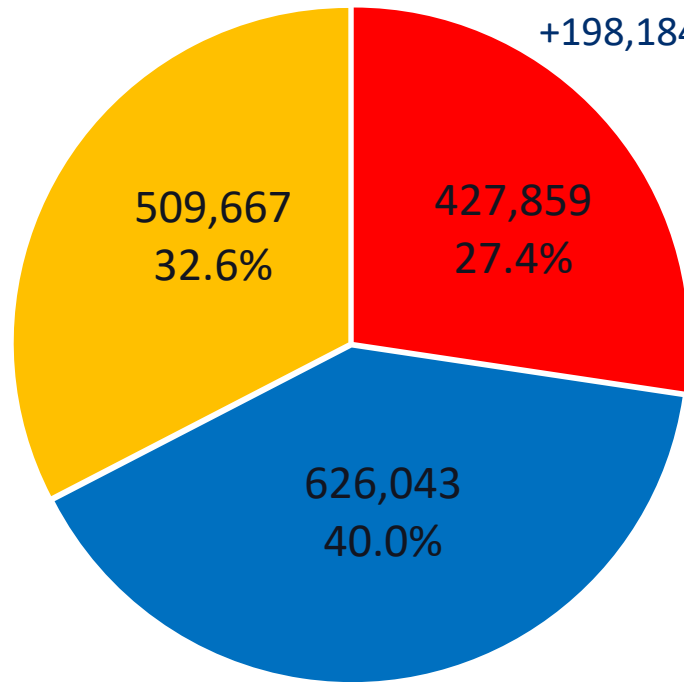

Miami-Dade County Voter File (As of June 2, 2021)

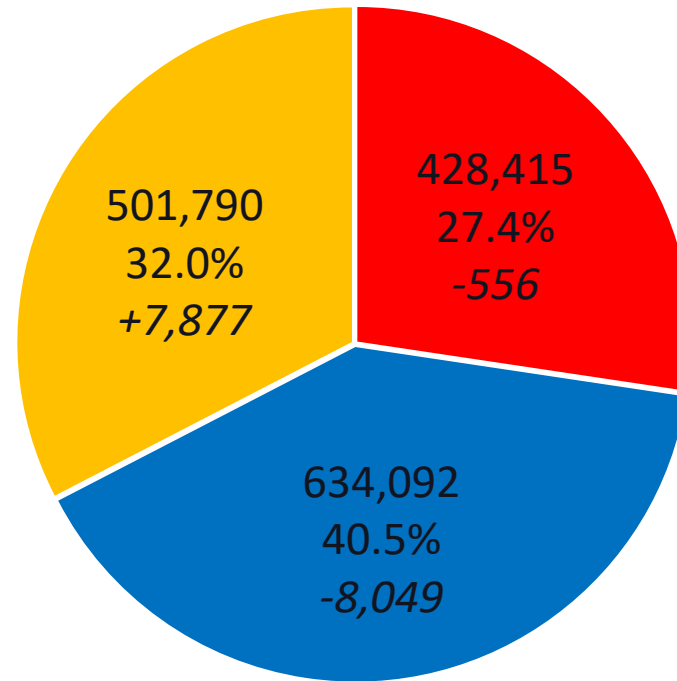

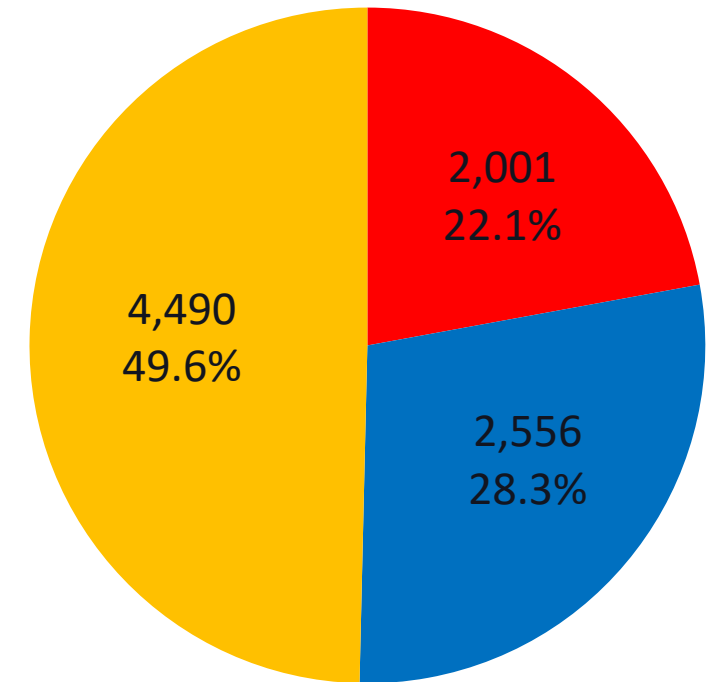
Miami-Dade County Voter File (2020 General Election)

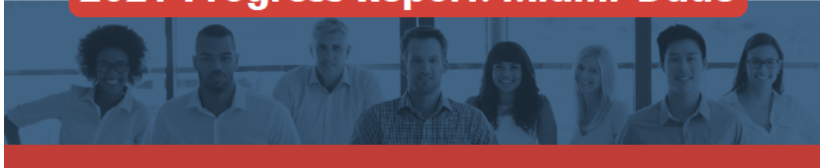

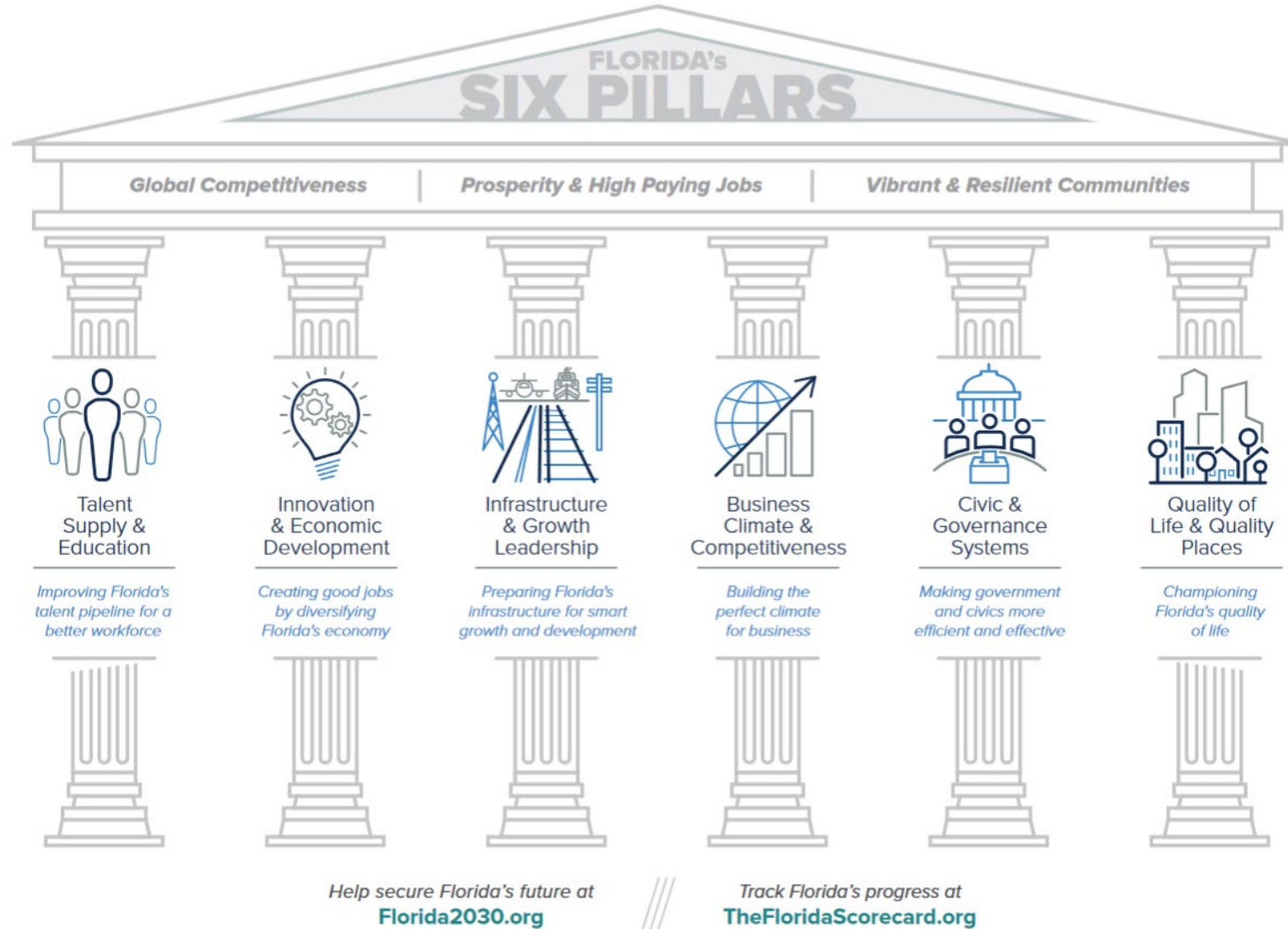

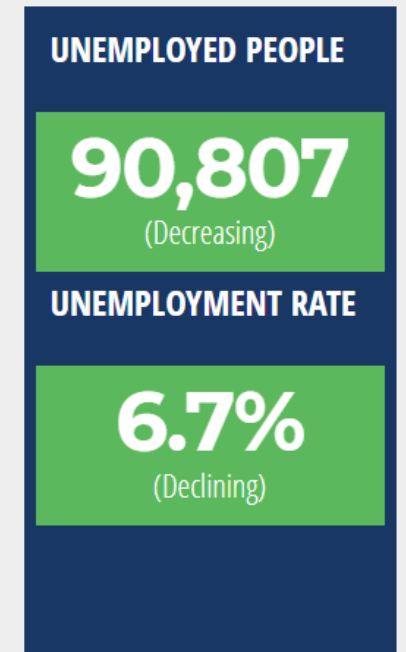
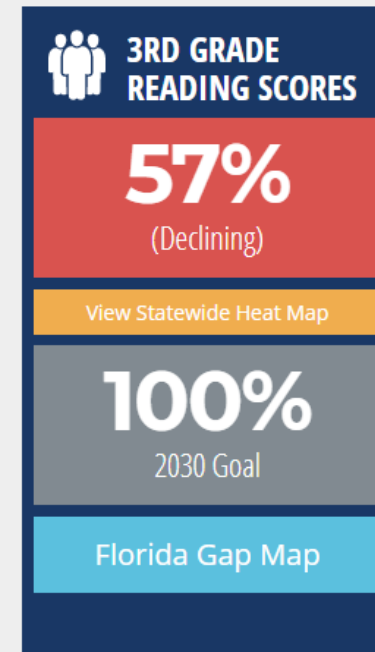
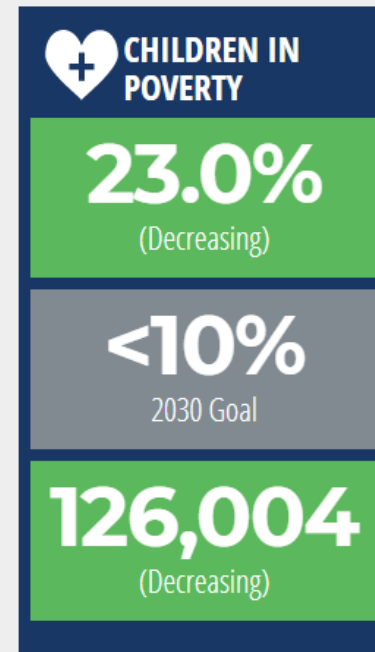
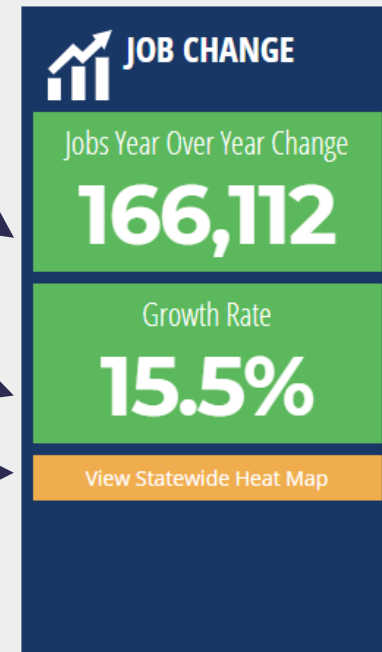
New heat map for Job Growth Rate

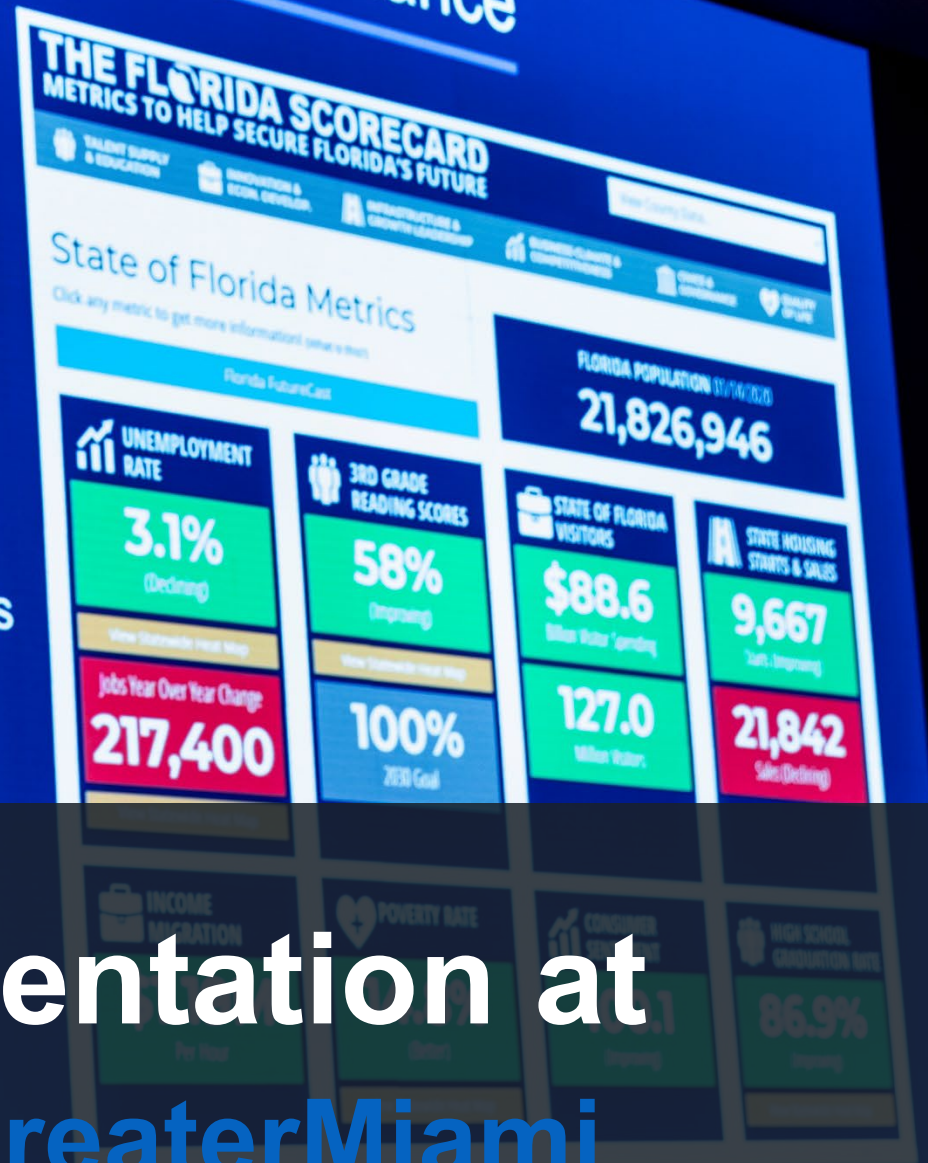
