Improves the current regulatory framework around autonomous vehicles by fostering innovation while maintaining safety

FLORIDA HURRICANE CATASTROPHE FUND (CAT FUND)

Makes the CAT Fund less stable and more susceptible to a "hurricane tax" by eliminating a key mechanism to fund the CAT Fund.

Creates an unworkable process for assignment of benefits reform that fails to protect consumers, address attorney fees and will destabilize rates.

SB 258: Sen. Farmer

Creates restrictions that would cause insurance rates to not be actuarially sound, which might cause insolvency.

Creates a new attorney fee schedule and addresses other provisions related to the Florida Supreme Court cases that resulted in 14.5 percent higher workers' comp premiums





EMPLOYMENT BACKGROUND CHECKS



SB 798: Sen. Braynon HB 1223 :Rep. McGhee

Prohibits job creators from considering an applicant's criminal history when determining to offer an initial interview.





EMPLOYMENT BACKGROUND CHECKS



HB 433 :Rep. Henry SB 102: Sen. Bracy

Prohibits job creators from considering an applicant's criminal history on an initial employment application.





MINIMUM WAGE



SB 166: Sen. Rodriguez HB 1441: Rep. Jacquet

Increases the state's minimum wage to \$15.25 an hour by 2023, beginning with a \$1 an hour increase in 2018.

HB 19: Rep. Grall SB 150: Sen. Lee

Repeals Personal Injury Protection auto insurance and replaces with mandatory Bodily Injury Insurance.





FLORIDA COMMISSION ON HUMAN RELATIONS



HB 307: Rep. Antone SB 300: Sen. Rouson

Proposes changes to the Florida Commission on Human Relations, which investigates charges against businesses of discrimination





EMERGENCY EVACUATIONS



SB 1828: Sen. Rodriguez HB 225: Rep. Davis

Creates a new cause of action against employers who take an action against an employee for failing to return to work within 14 days of an emergency evacuation.





TARGETED TAX REFORM



HB 7087: Rep. Renner SB 620: Sen. Passidomo, Sen. Stargel

Continues the reduction of the business rent tax, and includes sales tax holidays and hurricane recovery efforts. Contained in the Tax Package the Legislature will take up on March 11, 2018.

CORPORATE INCOME TAX "PIGGYBACK"



SB 502: Sen. Stargel HB: 7093: Rep. Renner

Adopts federal income tax code for purposes of Florida corporate income tax, with some exceptions related to the federal Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017.

SB 1400: Sen. Steube HB 773: Rep. La Rosa

Protects the private property rights of owners by establishing a statewide framework for the use of short term vacation rentals.
