










Population Changes by Age Group 2016-2030







Constitutional Amendments

- Constitution Revision Commission: Eight proposals made it to the final ballot.
- Paid Petition Initiatives:
 - Voter Approval of Casino Gambling
 - Restoration of voting rights for those with prior felony convictions
- Legislative Initiatives \bullet
 - Homestead Exemption
 - Cap on non-homestead assessments
 - 2/3^{rds} to raise taxes/fees by Legislature
