



100% of children are ready for kindergarten














Palm Beach County – 3rd Grade Reading








Change in Number of Business Establishments 2010 to 2017







Changes in numbers of Jobs – 2010 to 2017








Average Yearly Wage Increase By County 2010-2017








Florida Registration Comparisons Over Time








New Voters By County (Florida v. Palm Beach County)
