

#### How Florida's Exporters should approach the Spanish Market

- ❖ Work with somebody Spanish or deep knowledge of the Spanish market and the European Union Regulation.
- Presence at Trade Shows in key industry sectors.
- **Prepare and provide presentations and information about your products or services.**
- **\*** Enterprise Florida's Spain Office participates annually at a minimum of 4 seminars in Spain, promoting Florida products to Spanish companies.
- **\*** You need to target specific regions in Spain and sectors.
- Pre-study the market and the competition (quality, prices, etc...)

#### How to conduct businesses in Spain – Useful advices

- Dress formally.
- Most of the business in Spain done over a lunch or dinner.
- Never be in a hurry when doing business with a Spaniard.
- Usually anyone over 50 is not comfortable speaking in English.
- Spaniards never talk politics when doing business.
- > Be extremely polite / educated while doing business.
- > Spanish companies can be potential partners for doing business in Latin America. 50% of the Latam FDI comes from Spain.




#### Spanish FDI in the USA

- Spain was the 4th largest investor in the US in 2007, 6th in 2008 and 9th in 2009.
- 3rd largest investor worldwide in 2008 just behind USA and France.
- 70 billion invested by Spain for the last 30 years.



#### **Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund (QTI)**

\$3,000-\$6,000 tax refund per full time job created

# **Capital Investment Tax Credit** (CITC)

An annual credit provided for up to twenty years

# Machinery and Equipment Sales Tax Exemption

Exemption available for new businesses

# Quick Response Training (QRT)

Provides grant funding for customized training to new or expanding businesses

# Research and Development Tax Credit

Maximum allowable credits for all businesses in 2018 calendar year is \$16.5 million

#### **Sales Tax Exemptions**

Exemption on business purchases, machinery, and R&D equipment





# **Opportunity Watch**



MIAMI: January 29, 2019. The Brazilian Post Office (Correios) has launched a global ecommerce service at Miami Airport called 'Compra Fora' (Buy Outside). The country is Latin America's largest economy and was responsible for an estimated 65 percent of the region's e-commerce sales in 2018.

- Classifies all e-commerce exports to Brazil from MIA as domestic cargo – thus expediting their arrival to final destination from weeks to days.
- The Brazilian Government designated MIA as the only airport in the United States able to preclear E-commerce to Brazil.

# Port Tampa Bay Welcomes New Direct Asian Container Service



Port Tampa Bay is pleased to welcome COSCO Shipping's announcement that it will add Port Tampa Bay to its Gulf of Mexico Express (GME) Transpacific service, with the first vessel M/V COSCO PIRAEUS scheduled to arrive Tampa on January 28, 2019.



Port Everglades Signs MOU with the Honduras National Port Authority

The MOU outlines joint initiatives the two parties may undertake and states that it is within "their mutual interest to establish an alliance of cooperation aimed at facilitating international trade and generating new business by promoting the all-water routes between" Port Everglades and Honduran seaports.
