#### **Executive Orders:**

### 6/3/2020

Executive Order 20-139; Phase 2: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery (EO-20-139.pdf)

- Articulates Governor DeSantis' Phase 2 plan to reopen Florida and provides an effective date of Friday, June 5 at 12:01 a.m.
- 64 counties with the exception of Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties, may begin Phase 2. Those three counties can be considered upon approval with a written request from the County Mayor or the County Administrator.
- Extends Executive Orders 20-80 and 20-82 with exceptions for persons involved in commercial
  activity and students traveling for the purpose of academic work, internships, sports training
  and any other activity or program approved by the educational institution.
- The EO allows:
  - Restaurants and other establishments, and bars and other vendors, to operate at 50% indoor capacity. All bar areas may be open with seated service. This section does not apply to nightclubs.
  - Entertainment businesses, including movie theaters, concert houses, auditoriums,
     playhouses, bowling alleys, and arcades may operate at 50% percent building capacity.
  - Pari-mutuel facilities to operate with a written request from the County Mayor or the County Administrator and after approval from DBPR.
  - Personal services, including tattooing, body piercing, acupuncture, tanning and massage, to operate with appropriate safety guidelines as outlined by the Department of Health.
- Extends Executive Order 20-69 until June 30, 2020.

### 6/1/2020

Executive Order 20-137; Limited Extension of Mortgage Foreclosure and Eviction Relief (EO-20-137.pdf)

Extends Executive Order 20-94 until July 1, 2020.

### 5/22/2020

Executive Order 20-131; Expanding Full Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery (EO 20-131.pdf)

Enables organized youth activities to operate effective immediately.

### 5/15/2020

Executive Order 20-123; Full Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery (EO 20-123.pdf)

- Articulates the "Full Phase 1" standards and provides an effective date of Monday, May 18<sup>th</sup>.
   Those standards include:
  - An expansion of the lawful capacity of restaurants, museums, libraries and retail establishments to 50% with proper social distancing.

- The opening of gyms and fitness centers at 50% capacity with appropriate social distancing and sanitation practices.
- A process by which counties may seek state approval to operate vacation rentals within their jurisdiction and amusement parks may submit plans for reopening with local approval.

### 5/14/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-122; Broward and Miami-Dade Counties to Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan</u> for Florida's Recovery (EO 20-122.pdf)

• Broward and Miami-Dade Counties are allowed to begin Phase 1, outlined in EO-112, effective May 18<sup>th</sup> at 12:01 a.m.

Executive Order 20-121; Limited Extension of Mortgage Foreclosure and Eviction Relief (EO 20-121.pdf)

- Extends Executive Order 20-94 until 12:01 a.m. on June 2, 2020.
- Suspends mortgage foreclosures for residential and commercial properties and eviction for non-payments of rent by residential tenants due to COVID-19 until June 2.
- Does not relieve an individual from their obligation to make mortgage or rent payments.

# 5/9/2020

Executive Order 20-120; Expanding Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery (EO 20-120.pdf)

- Palm Beach County is allowed to begin Phase 1, outlined in EO-112, effective May 11<sup>th</sup> at 12:01 a.m.
- Barbershops, hair salons and nail salons that adopt appropriate social distancing and safety measures as outlined by DBPR may re-open beginning May 11<sup>th</sup>.

## 5/8/2020

Executive Order 20-114; Extension of Executive Order 20-52 - COVID-19 (EO 20-114.pdf)

Extends the state of emergency declared in EO 20-52 for 60 days.

### 4/29/2020

Executive Order 20-112; Phase 1: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery (EO 20-112.pdf)

- Articulates Governor DeSantis' Phase 1 plan to reopen Florida. This includes allowing:
  - Restaurants and food establishments on-premises consumption of food and beverage, so long as they adopt appropriate social distancing measures and limit their indoor occupancy to no more than 25 percent of their building occupancy.
  - In-store retail sales establishments to open storefronts if they operate at no more than 25 percent of their building occupancy and abide by the safety guidelines issued by the CDC and OSHA.
  - Museums and libraries to open at no more than 25 percent of their building occupancy

 Elective surgeries at hospital ambulatory surgical centers, office surgery centers, dental offices, orthodontic offices, endodontic offices or other health care practitioners' offices.

EO 20-112 continues to strongly encourage senior citizens and individuals with a significant underlying medical condition to stay at home. Additionally, it states that all persons in Florida should continue to avoid large groups, avoid nonessential travel and adhere to guidelines from the CDC regarding isolation for 14 days following travel on a cruise or from any international destination and any area with a significant presence of COVID-19. **This EO excludes Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties.** 

<u>Executive Order 20-111; Limited Extension of Essential Services and Activities and Vacation Rental Prohibition (EO 20-111.pdf)</u>

Extends Executive Orders 20-87 and 20-91 until 12:01 am May 4, 2020.

# 4/16/2020

Executive Order 20-104; Emergency Temporary Action Related to Unemployment Compensation (EO 20-104.pdf)

• Suspends the biweekly "actively seeking work" reporting requirement by claimants.

## 4/10/2020

Executive Order 20-103; Extending Executive Order 20-87 on Vacation Rental Closures (EO 20-103.pdf)

Extends Executive Order 20-87, related to vacation rentals, until April 30, 2020.

### 4/8/2020

Executive Order 20-97; Municipal Elections in Pasco County (EO 20-97.pdf)

 Delays elections in Pasco County at the request of Pasco County Supervisor of Elections Brian Corley.

### 4/6/2020

Executive Order 20-95; Documentary Stamps for SBA Loans (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-95.pdf)

 Directs the Department of Revenue to issue an emergency order suspending document stamp taxation imposed under Chapter 201, Florida Statutes, for notes and other written obligations made pursuant to Title I of the CARES Act. In short, the Governor's order allows employers receiving money from the Paycheck Protection Program and Economic Injury Disaster Loan to use the full dollar amount to pay employees, rent and other bills.

# 4/2/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-94; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Mortgage Foreclosure and Eviction Relief</u> (<a href="https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO">https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO</a> 20-94.pdf)

- Suspends mortgage foreclosures for residential and commercial properties and eviction for non-payments of rent by residential tenants due to COVID-19 emergency for 45 days.
- Does not relieve an individual from their obligation to make mortgage or rent payments

<u>Executive Order 20-93; COVID-19 Emergency Order – Reemployment Assistance Program (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-93.pdf)</u>

 Directs the Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) and other executive agencies to take necessary actions to improve DEO's Reemployment Assistance Program. These actions include emergency procurement of resources needed to accommodate the increase in the number of applications.

# 4/1/2020

Executive Order 20-92; Amends Executive Order 20-91; Essential Services and Activities During COVID-19 Emergency (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-92.pdf)

Allows local governments to adopt stricter regulations than what is contained within Executive
Order 20-91 and makes clear that local governments may not add essential services to the list of
those so designated in EO-91 without approval from the State Coordinating Officer in
coordination with the Surgeon General.

<u>Executive Order 20-91; Essential Services and Activities During COVID-19 Emergency</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-91-compressed.pdf)

- Requires all persons in Florida to limit their movements and personal interactions outside of their home to only those necessary to obtain or provide essential services or conduct essential activities.

- Essential activities include attending religious services, participating in outdoor recreational
  activities (while practicing social distancing), taking care of pets and caring for a loved one or
  friend.

## 3/31/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-90; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Broward and Palm Beach County Closures</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-90.pdf)

- Directs Broward and Palm Beach County beaches to remain closed pursuant to Executive Order 20-68
- The Broward County Administrator and the Palm Beach County Administrator shall have the ability to enforce, relax, modify or remove these beach closures, as warranted.

### 3/30/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-89; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Miami-Dade County, Broward County, Palm Beach County, Monroe County Public Access Restrictions (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-89.pdf)</u>

• Orders Miami-Dade County, Broward County, Palm Beach County and Monroe County to restrict public access to businesses and facilities deemed non-essential.

<u>Executive Order 20-88; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Re-employment of Essential Personnel</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-88.pdf)

- Allows the re-employment or continued employment of certain state employees under the state retirement system if it assists the COVID-19 emergency response.
- Applies to employees in the following:
  - Law enforcement officers
  - First responders
  - Emergency management and public safety personnel
  - Health and medical professionals
  - Other critical COVID-19 response personnel as identified and determined by a state agency head

### 3/27/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-87; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Vacation Rental Closures</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-87.pdf)

- Orders all parties engaged in rental of vacation rental properties to suspend vacation rental
  operations. Vacation rentals are prohibited from making new reservations or bookings and shall
  not accept new guests for check-in for the duration of this order.
- Order expires on April 10, 2020 unless the Governor extends the order in a subsequent order.

Executive Order 20-86; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Additional Requirements of Certain Individuals Traveling to Florida (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-86.pdf)

 Directs all persons who enter the State of Florida from an area with substantial community spread, to include the State of Louisiana, inclusive of those entering the State of Florida by roadways, to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.

# 3/26/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-85; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Telehealth and Immunizations for State Group Insurance (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-85.pdf)</u>

• Extends telehealth programs and immunizations to state employees without any additional costs to the employee.

### 3/24/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-83; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Protective Measures for Vulnerable Populations, Gatherings of Private Citizens and Density of the Workforce (https://www.flgov.com/wpcontent/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-83.pdf)</u>

• Directs the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer to issue a public health advisory to all persons over 65 years of age urging, but not mandating, them to stay home and to take such other measures as necessary to limit their risk of exposure to COVID-19.

<u>Executive Order 20-82 Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Isolation of Individuals Traveling to Florida</u> (<a href="https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-82.pdf">https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-82.pdf</a>)

 Directs all persons who enter the State of Florida from an area with substantial community spread, to include the New York Tri-State Area (Connecticut, New Jersey and New York), to isolate or quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.

## 3/23/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-80; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Airport Screening and Isolation</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-80.pdf)

Directs all persons whose point of departure originates from outside the State of Florida in an
area with substantial community spread, to include the New York Tri-State Area (Connecticut,
New Jersey and New York), and entering the State of Florida through airports to isolate or
quarantine for a period of 14 days from the time of entry into the State of Florida or the
duration of the person's presence in the State of Florida, whichever is shorter.

### 3/20/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-72; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Non-essential Elective Medical Procedures (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-72.pdf)</u>

All hospitals, ambulatory surgical centers, office surgery centers, dental, orthodontic and
endodontic offices, and other health care practitioners' offices in the state of Florida are
prohibited from providing any medically unnecessary, non-urgent or non-emergency procedure
or surgery which, if delayed, does not place a patient's immediate health, safety or wellbeing at

risk, or will, if delayed, not contribute to the worsening of a serious or life-threatening medical condition.

<u>Executive Order 20-71; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Alcohol Sales, Restaurants, and Gyms</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-71.pdf)

- Restricts vendors to only sell alcohol in sealed containers to be consumed off-premises.
- Suspends all restaurants within the state of Florida from on-premise food consumption for customers. Kitchens may continue to operate for take-out and delivery services.
- Closes all gyms and fitness centers in Florida

<u>Executive Order 20-70; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Broward and Palm Beach County</u> Closures (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO\_20-70.pdf)

- Orders all restaurants, bars, taverns, pubs, night clubs, banquet halls, cocktail lounges, cabarets, breweries, cafeterias and any other alcohol and/or food service business establishment with seating for more than ten people within Broward County and Palm Beach County to close onpremises service of customers.
- This order does not not apply to delivery services, pick-up or take out services.

<u>Executive Order 20-69; Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Local Government Public Meetings</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-69.pdf)

- Suspends state requirements that local governmental bodies have a physical quorum and that
  those meetings be located in a specific public place and allows for the use of telephonic and
  video conferencing.
- The executive order does NOT waive any of the Florida Sunshine Laws.

## 3/17/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-68; Emergency Management – COVID-19 regarding bars, beaches, and restaurants</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-68.pdf)

- Requires bars, pubs and nightclubs that generate more than 50% of its gross revenue from the sale of alcohol to suspend the sale of alcohol for 30 days starting 3/17/2020.
- Limits individuals accessing public beaches to gatherings of 10 or fewer people.
- Requires restaurants to limit occupancy to 50% of current building occupancy, to keep a 6-foot distance between groups and limits groups of patrons to 10 individuals.

## 3/9/2020

<u>Executive Order 20-52; Emergency Management – COVID-19 Public Health Emergency</u> (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-52.pdf)

- Declares a state of emergency exists within the State of Florida to access emergency resources and additional powers available during a state of emergency.
- Designates the Director of the Division of Emergency Management as the State Coordinating
   Officer and directs him to execute the state Comprehensive Emergency Plan
- Allows medical workers, social workers and counselors with valid licenses in good standing from other states to practice in Florida under the Red Cross or with the Florida Department of Health

### 3/1/2020

Executive Order 20-51; Establishes Coronavirus Response Protocol and Directs Public Health Emergency (https://www.flgov.com/wp-content/uploads/orders/2020/EO 20-51.pdf)

- Directs State Health Officer and Surgeon General, Dr. Scott Rivkees, to declare a public health emergency in the State of Florida. Additionally, it directs the State Health Officer to follow the guidelines established by the CDC in establishing protocols to control the spread of COVID-1 9 and educate the public on prevention.
- Requires the Florida Department of Health to actively monitor, at a minimum, all persons
  meeting the definition of a Person Under Investigation ("PUI") as defined by the CDC for COVID19 for a period of at least 14 days or until the PUI tests negative for COVID-19.
