

NEW Migration Data: What It Means for Florida

New data for 2024 reveals how Florida’s continued inflow strengthens the talent pool, particularly as new residents arrive from large, high-cost states with diverse skills and experience. While migration has slowed for Florida, and many other states, it has remained net positive and still serves as the driving force of Florida’s population growth.

A Competitive Economic Signal

While migration has slowed, this trend was consistent across many states. Florida remains first in the nation for in-migration, and second for net migration. Florida’s top national rankings send a clear message to investors and employers: **Florida remains a place where people want to live, work, and build careers.**



While net migration slowed, FL remains one of the strongest population magnets in the US.

The Bottom Line

Florida’s net migration is half of what it was last year, but this isn’t a signal that Florida is falling behind. States like Texas and North Carolina also saw significant drops in net migration. The numbers are showing that migration is cooling across the country, and Florida remains among the top amidst this slowdown.
